

Snip of Parish History - St John's Cathedral Part 2 Setting the scene

Bishop John Fleming in his excellent book outlines a history of dedication to St John the Baptist in the area going back many centuries to the emergence of organised Christianity from the early day of the 11th century and the first recorded Bishop, Gilbert, since St Munchin in the year 491. Indeed, there is an argument that the name of Garryowen, or Eoin's Garden, was actually a reference to the Knights Templar who gave their name to, amongst other places, Hospital in Co Limerick.

To understand fully how the Cathedral of the Diocese came to be built in St Johns we do need to place ourselves back in the Ireland of the mid-1800's.

Without delving too much into history, Catholicism in Ireland had been repressed pretty much since the reformation. Nearly all the wars fought across the continent in those years were religious. Indeed, much of the history of Limerick

of that time and especially around the sieges of Limerick were Catholicism against Protestantism. All of that changed after Catholic Emancipation and the work of Daniel O'Connell in the late 1820s and 1830s. The Catholic Church in Ireland underwent a re-emergence and in that time many of the churches that we now see across the country were constructed.

The old saying of "Cometh the hour, cometh the man" applies in the Limerick Diocese, and in the late 1820's a young vibrant Bishop, Dr John Ryan was appointed and his tenure as bishop was to revolutionise the diocese. Ironically his episcopal ordination took place in the old St John's Chapel which stood approximately on the site of the current Presbytery in 1825, a church which ultimately he saw the demolition of in favour of the construction of the Cathedral. The foundation stone of St Johns was laid on the first of May 1856 at a time when Limerick and Ireland were just emerging from the horrors of the great famine. George Lee drombanna@gmail.com
