The story of the Annunciation calls to our attention God's wondrous action in human history. God chose a human person to give birth to his Son so that all humanity would know God's salvation. Mary, already full of God's grace, was able to cooperate in this great plan for our salvation. Thus Jesus was born as one of us, fully human and also fully divine. This is the mystery we prepare to celebrate at Christmas, the mystery of the Incarnation. In the model of Mary, we pray that we will be people of faith who recognize God's saving plan for us and are able respond with obedience.

Update on Christmas Mass tickets: There are tickets available for the following days & times-

Wednesday @ 8am, 10am and 12.30, Christmas Eve 8am, Christmas Day 8am

Monday is the last day for ticket collection you can call to the Parish Office between 10am and 2.30pm.

Tickets must be presented on arrival for Christmas Mass.

The regulations say that there are to be no gatherings of people in the church grounds, so to avoid this we have provided a ticket system to control our numbers and keep everyone safe. We respectfully ask that those who do not have a ticket would not come to the Cathedral at Mass times.
