Reflection



This parable is held up to us today so that we can see ourselves in it and learn from it. Through the life, mission, death and resurrection, God offers the chance to reap an endlessly abundant harvest of love, mercy and forgiveness. They are offered to us freely out of love. Like those in the gospel, we have to choose freely whether to accept or decline God's generous offer. We are the tenants today and God has certain expectations of us. God looks to us to

produce the fruits of love, mercy, compassion and the values of the Kingdom of God. The burning question from this parable to us today is simple but challenging; what sort of fruits and harvest are we producing today though our ordinary daily lives as followers of Jesus?

For the past 5 weeks we have been asked to pray with and for creation in our Sunday liturgies and to think about ways in which we can care more deeply for our environment. As we reflect today, let us also be mindful that it is the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology. St. Francis saw God in all of creation and had a deep mystical relationship with all of nature. Let us pray today that we might re-awaken within us that same sense of awe and wonder and strive to protect our world, our common home.
