What sticks with me most about that day is not the height or scale of the building, nor the incredible stone carving and engineering but rather the names carved and written into the timber enclosure around the spiral staircase. These were the names of ordinary Limerick men now long gone but forever remembered through a scrawled autograph on this extraordinary structure.






