Second Sunday of Advent

Sunday 4th Dec 2022



This weekend sees the beginning of the Second Week of Advent. The word "Advent" comes from the Latin word "advenire" which means "to come" and during Advent we pray and think about two different comings of Christ. The first part of the season focuses our hearts and minds on Christ's second coming at the end of time and then in the latter part, from December 17th on, the focus changes to our annual celebration of Our Lord's birth at Christmas. Advent is a season of preparation when we wait in joyful hope for the coming of Our Lord. Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, and the season also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing and quieting our hearts for the full joy of Christmas. There are changes in the liturgy during Advent, for example the colour of the vestments worn at Mass changes from the green of Ordinary Time to violet or purple and the Gloria is not said or sung until the Vigil Mass of Christmas when, as the Angels sang it with great joy to the Shepherds that first Christmas night, we raise our voices in praise and gratitude for the love that the Father lavishes on us.

Most people have a crib at home, the custom of displaying figures depicting the birth of Jesus Christ can be traced back to St Francis of Assisi, who prepared the first Christmas crib or manger for Christmas Eve of 1223. The following blessing could be used when the crib is first set up or on Christmas Eve.

All make the sign of the cross as a family member says: "Our help is in the name of the Lord." and all present reply, "Who made heaven and earth."

The family members goes on, God of every nation and people, from the very beginning of creation you have shown us your love: when our need for a Saviour was great you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary.

To our lives he brings joy and peace, justice, mercy, and love.

Lord, bless all who look upon our crib; may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus, and raise our thoughts to him, who is God-with-us and Saviour of all, and who lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.
