The proper way to receive Holy Communion

To receive Holy Communion in the Catholic Church, you should follow these steps: *Be in a state of grace, meaning you have confessed any mortal sins*

and fasted for one hour before Mass.

Approach the altar with reverence and join your hands.

Receive the host either in the hand or on the tongue, according to your preference.

Say "Amen" and consume the host immediately.

When one receives Holy Communion standing, you are asked to make a specific act of adoration, a simple bowing of the head is sufficient, before receiving the Sacred Host. While waiting for the person in front of you to receive recollect yourself for a moment and bow your head as a gesture of adoration. Step up when it is your turn to receive.

If receiving in the hand, upon approaching the minister of the Host extend the hands in the middle of the chest.

The left hand is extended, with the right hand under the left in support (lefthanded people may wish to place the left hand under the right).

In this way a throne is formed to receive the Sacred Host.

The response of "Amen" is said, and the Host is consumed immediately, before turning away from the minister.

If receiving the Sacred Host on the tongue, one should join your hands. After saying" Amen" in response to the minister of Holy Communion, you should open your mouth and extend your tongue far enough so that the Sacred Host may be placed upon it without danger of falling.

Please note that it is important to extend the tongue, not just open the mouth.
