The Sermon on the Mount The Gospel we will hear today is taken from the Sermon on the Mount, the Gospels for the last two weekends and for the next two weekends are taken from this famous sermon of Jesus. It contains the core teaching of Our Saviour and our church and is taken from chapters 5-7 of St. Matthew's Gospel. Jesus preached it near the beginning of His ministry, and it is the longest of Jesus' sermons recorded in the New Testament, it is both challenging and encouraging in equal measure. In the sermon Jesus continues to call us to live in a noticeably different way than other people because His followers should hold to a much higher standard of conduct -- the standard of love and selflessness that Jesus Himself would live. In the Sermon of the Mount, Jesus also gives us both the Beatitudes and the Our Father. As we listen to the Gospel, over these weeks, pray that we will be drawn ever closer to the life we are called to live by Jesus.
