Feast of St. Brigid

February 1 - marks the first day of spring, and is also known as Lá Fhéile Bhríde, Saint Brigid's Feast Day. Brigid is one of Ireland's patron saints . One of the most common traditions of the day is to make a Saint Brigid's Cross. Brigid's crosses are made on Brigid's Eve, January 31st.

Candlemas Day

Sunday next February 2nd is Candlemas Day, also known as the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus Christ and the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is a Christian Holy Day commemorating the presentation of Jesus at the Temple. It is widely regarded as the end of the Christmas Season. There will be blessing of Candles at all masses. Candles are available to purchase in the gift shop.



Feast of St Blaise

Monday February 3rd is the Feast of St Blaise, throats will be blessed after both masses. The blessing of St. Blaise is a sign of our faith in God's protection and love for us and for the sick. Using two crossed and unlighted candles, the priest touches the throat of each person saying - "Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may you be freed from all sickness of the throat and from any other illness".



The Word of God

The word of God is something alive and active." Hebrews 4.12 Pope Francis has requested that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time each year is dedicated to the celebration of the Word of God. This reminds us of the beauty and the importance of the Word of God both in the Bible and in the readings at Mass. To mark the Sunday of the Word of God in the Cathedral this year, we had a copy of one volume of the St John's Bible. This is a large sized manuscript copy of the Bible, it is beautifully illustrated. We are very grateful to Mary Immaculate College and Fr. Eamonn Fitzgibbon for loaning the volume to the people of the parish. At the 12 noon Mass, the Gospel procession featured our parishioners, Zarah, her mother Noreen and her Grandmother

Breda who presented the book of the Gospels to Fr. Noel.

We are reminded that the Scriptures, like our faith, are passed on from generation to generation. There are many ways that we can become more familiar with the Word of God. We can buy a Bible and read a part of it every day. We can prepare for the Liturgy of the Word at Mass by going online and looking up the reading for the next weekend, we could buy a missal with the reading in it, or we could come to the Cathedral a little earlier than usual, and spend time looking over and praying with the readings. In any one of these ways the word of God can become alive and active in each of us.
