Reflection

Today, in our Gospel, John shares with us his understanding of where suffering and death fit with a God who is Love. They are, for him, one part of a much bigger work, constantly at play in our lives and in the life of creation. The seed must fall in the ground and die if it is later to produce a harvest. This reality is all around us. It is in the bread we eat, in the wine we drink, in ourselves and in our world. But it is not the end! The seed produces new life which produces a new harvest of goodness and plenty. In Jesus life the pain and suffering of the Cross led directly to the Resurrection and to a new and 'glorified' life of hope and joy.

opened its doors in November 2018 to people with dementia and their carers across Limerick. Held on the first Wednesday of every month from 6.30pm to 8.30pm, the club aims to provide a dementia friendly space where people socialise, enjoy refreshments, share information and enjoy activities to support people to live well with dementia. The club aspires to reduce social isolation and promote open discussion, fun activity, acceptance and new learning. It was set up by a small committee of volunteers, with a background in nursing, occupational therapy and social work who were concerned at the lack of dementia friendly social outlets for people with dementia in the community. There is no fee to attend. They run a fun interactive community choir in the same venue again for persons with dementia and their carers on the third and fourth Wednesdays of every month from 6.30pm to 8pm.
