## **Reflection:**

The Gospel today is from the Gospel of Saint Mark. Jesus clearly wants to have time for Himself, time to pray and time to be alone. Yet when Jesus sees the people, His heart is moved to be with them. "When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things." It is more important to be with the people and to show them the road to life than to be off by oneself, even in prayer to God. On the other hand, we know that Jesus always seeks out time for prayer. Even if Jesus does not get the time that He was hoping for, nevertheless, He always is praying. We are invited to become more and more like Jesus:

We need to learn the balance between being of service and being present to those we meet, time spent with Jesus in prayer can teach us this.

**COVID-19Vacines** Registration is now open for people aged 25 and above, you can register to get a free COVID-19 vaccine. <u>HSE Vaccine Reg</u> or telephone 1850 24 1850. If you're aged 18 to 34 or aged 50 or over, you can get a <u>Janssen single-dose COVID-19 vaccine</u> at a local pharmacy. You do not need to register online. But you do need to book an appointment through your pharmacy.
