We regret that, due to antisocial behaviour, the church will be closed Monday to Friday from 1.00pm to 3.30pm until we can find an appropriate solution.




Limerick Grow It Yourself is holding its first post lockdown meeting on Wednesday, 26th October 2022. It will be held in The Citizen's Innovation Lab on Sarsfield Street (The Old Dunnes Stores) at 7pm.

Our guest speaker is Ciaran King who grows intensively in a Limerick suburban garden. There is a €3 charge and all are very welcome.

The Thomond Archaeological and Historical Society would like to invite you to the next lecture in their Autumn series which will be held on October 24th at 8pm in Theatre T.1.17 in the Tara Building.

Dr Catherine Swift will speak on the fourteenth century manuscript known as the Black Book of Limerick and the evidence which it contains for the origins and early history of Kilmallock.



From April to October each year the Thomond organises outing to areas and sites of interest. These range from short evening walks around Limerick city and its environs to half-day trips within the general mid-west area and full day bus outings further afield. We often go on an annual weekend excursion within Ireland and an overseas trip in the month of May. In the autumn/winter/spring periods we arrange a lecture programme covering a broad range of topics. Each member also receives a free copy of the North Munster Antiquarian Journal produced by the Society and family membership is 30 euros per annum.
